WATCHING THEM GROW

Last spring when I brought my dahlias out of storage for starting in containers prior to planting, the garden was soaked. That's often the case early in the year, but generally we get a reprieve; the garden dries enough to rototill and I can begin transplanting in late May. Continued wet weather took that option away (first time in 18 years) so I went with my version of "no till" gardening. I hoed the weeds, dug holes for each dahlia, and eventually got all my starts placed in the garden. Weird weather seems to occur every year to one degree or another, but some years are weirder than others. Hearing and seeing on TV what Australia is going through, I believe the latter applies there as well!!!

The "no till" approach impressed upon me how valuable rototilling can be. Aside from the relative ease in preparing the garden, rototilling is an important pest preventative. I hadn't realized what great arterials mole tunnels make for mice. Without destroying those runways, the mice immediately traveled to my freshly transplanted dahlias and devoured root mass and even the lower stem. By summer's end, mice had eaten 40 dahlia plants (of 700) plus all the poison grain I cared to feed them. A switch in the weather to very hot and dry through July and August seemed to force the mice to search out dahlias for their moisture. Taking no chances at season's end, immediately after lifting my rootstocks, I rototilled.

Despite the challenges, my plants did well; blooms were competitive and mice well fed and watered. After the show season ends in our part of the country (mid-September), I stop disbudding, spraying for pests and allow nature to take its course. What had been a well guarded garden becomes an open garden particularly for the grandkids and their friends as well as the mothers (even an occasional father). Opening the garden to the kids has become somewhat of a tradition with some families having participated for several years. Watching them grow, enjoying their visits, and their collections of bouquets of dahlias has become a highlight of our season. Hopefully, some of these youngsters and their parents will become future dahlia growers.

Our 2011 season is quickly approaching. My first order of dahlia tubers arrived by mail January 31st. Good friend, Bob Merrell, a fellow Portland Dahlia Society member will be taking cuttings for me from these new varieties.

The American Dahlia Society (ADS) has remodeled its classification guide for 2011 going from a three to four digit numbering system. For example, last year, the variety Embrace had an ADS Classification # of 342, with the 3 identifying a 4-6 inch bloom and the 42 indicating a yellow semi-cactus bloom. For 2011, Embrace will have an ADS Classification # of 3202, with the 3 indicating a 4-6 inch bloom, the adjacent 2 a semi-cactus form and 02 for the color yellow. The change allows for more flexibility in expanding our ADS classification system. Last year, we combined straight cactus with incurved cactus blooms whereas in 2011 those are

separated. In color, black has been added to purple with the origination of more black blooms. The numerical arrangement of some forms has been juggled

somewhat as well. My hope is that all clubs follow the new ADS numerical arrangement instead of developing their own. I enter blooms at about a half dozen shows each year and the juggling of groups, particularly the “other types” has been difficult to deal with amongst the various shows. Maybe this will help more clubs follow the national lead.

A look into the future indicates the ADS National Show returns to the west coast for both 2011 & 2012. This year, the ADS National Show will be hosted by the Dahlia Society of California and held at the Santa Clara Marriot Hotel, August 18th – 22nd, in Santa Clara, California. Their website is ADS2011@org. Contact persons include Kevin Larkin at kevin@cgdahlias.com and Deborah Dietz at deborah@sfdahlia.org. The 2012 ADS National Show will be held in Portland, Oregon. Both venues present great opportunities to view thousands of dahlia blooms, partake of lectures and tours of private, public and commercial gardens, visit vendors and attend an awards banquet. Hopefully, some of you from down under will choose to attend. See you there.

Vic Dawes
My Life with Dahlias



In 1950 I had my first home built in the suburb of Sydney called Chester Hill, an outer suburb at that time.

I was working for a firm named Mauri Bros. Thomson making Malt Extract. My shift mate was a very keen Dahlia grower called Harry Westbrook. Harry was not an exhibitor just a very good grower from the suburb of Homebush and was a very good customer of Tom Young (Young's Dahlias) from whom he brought tubers.

Harry gave me some good varieties to start my front garden off after the usual crop of potatoes had been grown to break up the soil. From then on I have never been without dahlias in my garden. A couple of years later I was asked if I would supply the Chester Hill Bowling Club with flowers for the Grand opening, I was chuffed and could not get my flowers there quick enough, and stand back and wonder at the display.

I departed Sydney in 1970 and moved to Melbourne to work where I purchased a flat in Brighton and with the approval of the other tenants in the block in went the dahlias in the front of the block. Facing the street I lost a few flowers to passing people but all in all I was happy having my dahlias.

Time came for retirement and I finished up at Bomaderry (near Nowra) living in a house with not much garden. Along the back fence looked a good place for some dahlias so off went an order to Bruce Hannel for a dozen tubers and I was on my way.

A few months later I was informed by a lady that the next meeting of the garden club was to be entertained by a guest speaker on dahlias. I was there with bells on and the honourable guest speaker was Robert Curll. I went home that night with a couple of flowers and a promise – yes I was on a promise of some tubers if I went to see him come September, and he was good at his word. He had some tubers for me but in return I was to promise that I would enter flowers in the Nowra show in the novice section.

I did this and as I was the only entry I was declared the winner, the prize was twenty dollars worth of tubers donated by Mr Smith, a local grower. By the time the tubers were dug, Mr Smith had retired from the sport so my first win was a flop.

The following year my wife became ill and could not be left for any length of time so I rushed an entry to Berry Show and for goodness sake I won the Championship from a good field.

The flowers were Como Polly, Figurine and Mrs J Robertson. That gave me great heart, little did I think that I would be showing for a further ten years before I would win another Championship. That was the case but I never flagged and I finally won another Championship.

Since then I have continually shown in the minor league with various successes but at all times enjoying my hobby meeting and enjoying the company of fellow growers and making friends with interstate growers at the annual Australian Dahlia Council conferences. I am now eighty-five years old and hopefully want to be on the bench at ninety.

Dahlia growers keep a smile on your face at all times and even when not winning you will be having fun and enjoying the company of fellow growers.

Thank you all for allowing me to be a part of the dahlia fraternity.
